Welcome to DELPEX 2025

For 2025 our annual DELPEX stamp show celebrates the 200th anniversary of the opening of the Erie Canal. Conceived by Governor DeWitt Clinton in order to facilitate trade in an era when transportation was limited to horse and wagon, it opened a pathway from the Atlantic Ocean to the Great Lakes using mule-drawn barges. It is 351 miles long, 12 feet deep and 40 feet wide, increased from the original 4 foot depth. At the time it was the world's second longest canal and the "nation's first superhighway." The termini are at the Niagara River near Buffalo and near Albany on the Hudson River. The tolls charged paid off the construction cost in the first year of operation, and it remained competitive with railroads until about 1902. Trucking and the St. Lawrence Seaway have reduced its use in recent years largely to recreational boating.

A warm welcome is extended to our previous DELPEX visitors and newcomers alike. Enjoy examining the exhibits and shopping at our dealers' tables, but don't forget to fill out the ballot for your favorite exhibit, as the winner gets a special award. We are repeating our "Members' Showcase" this year, a selection of pages showing our club members' range of interests. The dealers in our bourse area trade in a wide range of philatelic material at very attractive prices. In the back of the room, the Postal Service station has on hand a full selection of recent issues plus many older issues. The staff will be happy to service your show covers with a special cancel. Prepared souvenir covers are available at a special table, both canceled and unserviced. Many philatelic publications are available at our lobby reception table as well at no cost.

Over the years, one of our show's most popular features has been the bid board auction, which closes at 3:30 PM. The lots are displayed all day at the side of the room. Also, don't forget to sign in at the reception desk so we can send an invitation next year. Above all, relax, and spend the day involved in your favorite hobby.

DELPEX 2025







The 2025 DELPEX show cover will be franked with the stamp issued in 1967 for the Erie Canal sesquicentennial. The canal was started in 1817, as shown on the stamp, but was not completed and opened until 1825. An additional 68¢ is added to make upthe current first class rate. The cachet includes an illustration of one of the canal boats, which carried both goods and passengers, and were drawn by mules on a path at the side. Prepared and unstamped covers for those who wish to prepare their own are available at a table in the hall's lobby.

The personnel at the USPS sub-station at the rear of the hall will gladly apply a special show cancel for you.

The Erie Canal

The Erie Canal is a historic canal in upstate New York which runs east to west between the Hudson River and Lake Erie. Proposed first in the 1780s, construction was not authorized until 1817 and it was completed in 1825. This was the first navigable waterway between the Atlantic Ocean and the Great Lakes, vastly reducing costs of transportation of people and goods across the Appalachians. It greatly accelerated the settlement of the Great Lakes region, the economy of New York state and the westward expansion of the United States as a nation. It has been called "The Nation's First Superhighway," as no comparable long distance route previously existed for wheeled vehicles or boats. Before railroads, water transport was the most cost-effective way to ship goods. A mule could only carry about 250 pounds, but that same mule could pull a barge loaded with up to 60,000 pounds of goods, a 95% reduction in transportation costs.

Opponents of its main supporter, Governor DeWitt Clinton denigrated the canal as "Clinton's Folly" and "Clinton's Big Ditch." The expense would be very costly even today, and President Thomas Jefferson called it "little short of madness", however the income from tolls more than covered the cost of its construction by the end of its first year of operation. The westward route gave New York City a great economic advantage over other East Coast ports, as well as the other cities on the route, Albany, Utica, Syracuse, Rochester and Buffalo.

The canal was the major engineering achievement of the period, and originally was 40 feet wide, 4 feet deep and 363 miles long. The mode of travel was in mule-drawn barges. From 1905 to 1918, major changes in the canal were made and much of the original route was abandoned. Its current dimensions are 120 feet wide, 12 feet in depth and 351 miles long. There are 34 locks on the canal, plus two more to reach Lake Erie or at Troy on the Hudson River.


The peak year of use was 1855, when over 33,000 transits took place. The canal was competitive with railroads until about 1902, but commercial traffic suffered greatly in the latter half of the 20th century due to the rise of long-distance trucking and the opening in 1959 of the St. Lawrence Seaway, which offered seagoing ships direct access to the Great Lakes via the St. Lawrence River. The last regularly scheduled commercial service on the canal was in 1994, and today the major use is recreational boating. Sight-seeing tours on the canal are offered by a number of companies. The Erie Canal connects three other canals and is a tourist attraction in its own right, with several parks and museums dedicated to its history. A popular bicycling path follows the course of the canal across the state today.



Delaware Postal History

In 1683, William Penn authorized the establishment of a weekly post to New Castle, Delaware. New Castle remained the only post town within what are now the boundaries of the state of Delaware until 1775. As late as 1790, there were only three post offices in Delaware: Wilmington, Dover and Duck Creek (now Smyrna). By 1798 the number of offices had grown to twelve.

While Delaware became a state on December 7, 1787, the statehood postal system officially started on September 2, 1788. Before this date, the British postal system was still largely in use.

The Delaware population expanded from 59,000 in 1790 to 73,000 in 1820, but the number of towns with post offices increased at an even greater rate, from the first three formed in 1788 to twenty-six by 1820. In 1850 there were 72 towns with post offices. In all, 268 different town or location-named post offices have existed. The maximum number in existence at any one point in time was about 200, due to closed and combined post offices. Today only about 65 towns in Delaware have townnamed post offices, and that number is likely to decrease in the future.

The study of Delaware stampless cover cancellations as well as stamp usages until about 1920 are subjects which continue to be examined by a few Delaware postal history collectors. New cancellations continue to be discovered, as well as earlier dates of first known use, differently colored cancels and interesting historical information.

If you have a collection of Delaware postal history covers, or are interested in this subject, you should consider joining the Delaware Postal History Society. One of the projects now in progress is a census of all known stampless covers from Delaware.
